Given that:

Nuclear power cannot exist without significant government subsidies for initial design, long-term waste storage and power plant decommissioning.

Economists & the investment community favour distributed energy systems vs. large-scale centralized power projects.

Radioactive waste - including the plant itself - remains radioactive for thousands of years, with no known way to safely dispose of the waste.

Nuclear facilities in Alberta will put the province in the running for the long-term storage site for Canada's nuclear waste.

A nuclear accident or terrorism could irradiate the Tar Sands and close that resource for years or decades.

The routine releases of radiation coming from nuclear plants are more dangerous to human health than previously thought.

And given that a nuclear power plant uses forty times the water used by a city the size of Calgary or Edmonton...

I urge you and your government colleagues to develop a progressive energy policy that encourages conservation and the development of safe, clean and renewable energy sources like wind, solar and geo-thermal energy. I also urge you to KEEP ALBERTA NUCLEAR FREE!
